Peter Ashman

Peter is Publishing Director at the BMJ Group. He sits on the Group's Executive Committee and has responsibility for the Group's journal print and online publishing programme which includes the BMJ and 25+ specialty titles. He also heads up the BMJ Group's Affinity programme which offers publishing services to medical societies and manages the Group's new product development team. Previously, Peter was Publishing Director at Nature Publishing Group where he conceived and launched the Nature Clinical Practice series of titles and before that was at The Lancet in London and New York for seven years.

Ian Borthwick

I am currently Commissioning Editor for Sustainable Energy Production and Environmental Technology at Woodhead Publishing Limited, UK, a leading independent, international, reference book publisher. I previously worked for IWA Publishing Limited, UK, the publishing arm of the International Water Association, where I worked across the company's diverse programme of environmental books, journals, reports, manuals and online services. My earlier background was in database management for one of the UK's foremost independent marketing agencies. I have worked in STM publishing – my chosen career path – for close to five years, and I am highly interested in the future development of the industry.

H. Frederick Dylla

H. Frederick Dylla is the Executive Director and CEO of the American Institute of Physics, a not-for-profit umbrella organization for 10 scientific societies, a publisher of scientific journals and provider of information-based products and services. Since assuming this position in 2007, Dylla has played an active role in strengthening the government and public relations for STM publishers. He served on the Program Committee for the STM 2008 Spring Conference and, in February 2008, was elected to the PSP Executive Council. Prior, Dylla was with the U.S. Department of Energy's Thomas Jefferson National Accelerator Facility in Newport News, Virginia for 17 years while he concurrently held an adjunct professorship at the College of William and Mary. The author of over 190 publications, Dylla received his B.S., M.S. and Ph.D. in physics from M.I.T. A Past President of AVS and a Fellow of the American Physical Society, Dylla has served on numerous national advisory boards.

Cliff Morgan

Cliff has worked in publishing for over 30 years, mostly in Production and Publishing Technology. He began in Journals Production at Pergamon Press, and has worked in the Netherlands (Martinus Nijhoff), and for Holt-Saunders in Eastbourne.
