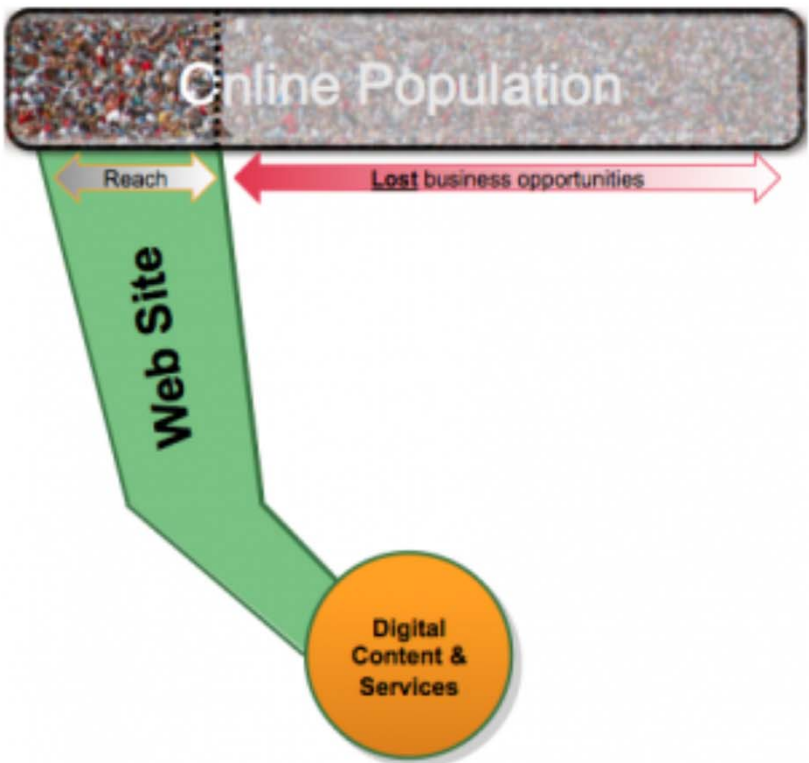

New Web “distribution models” driving reach and network effect

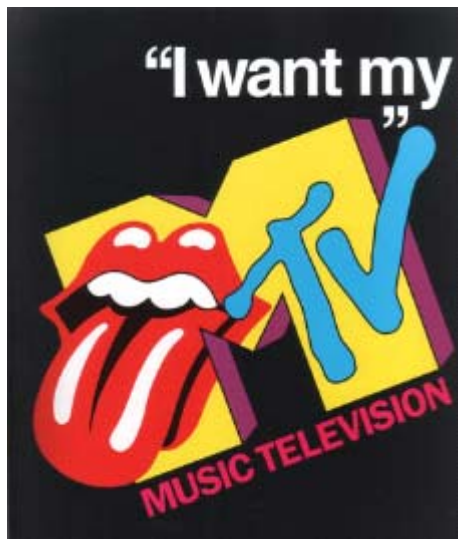

Old players – New distribution model

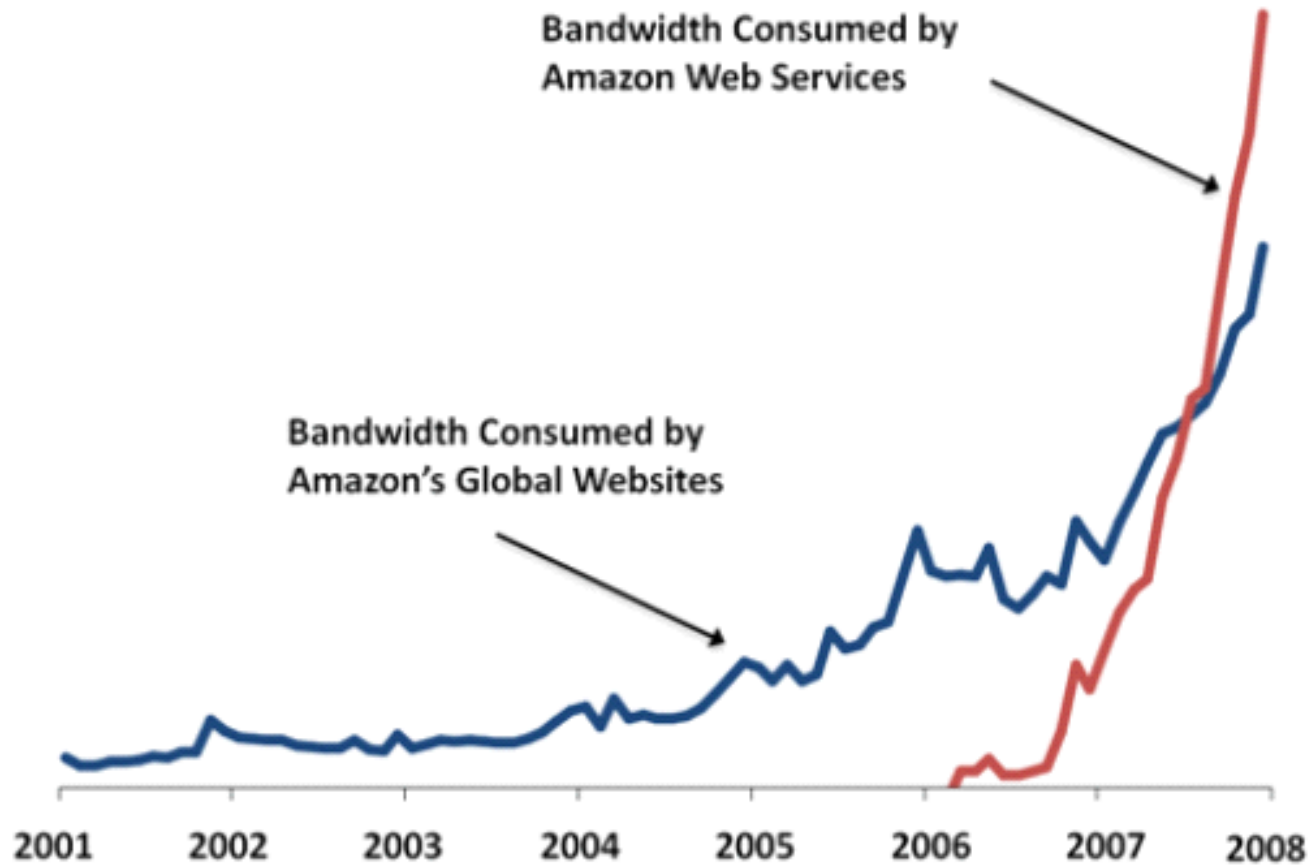

Technical Improvements

- Javascript based - limits to use to web apps only
- Results returned in XML rather than JSON

Policy Improvements

- Non-commercial use only
- Non-Scopus IP access
- Cannot change the order in which the Scopus search results appear
- Intermixing search Results from sources other than Scopus
- **No full-text access** (machine readable)

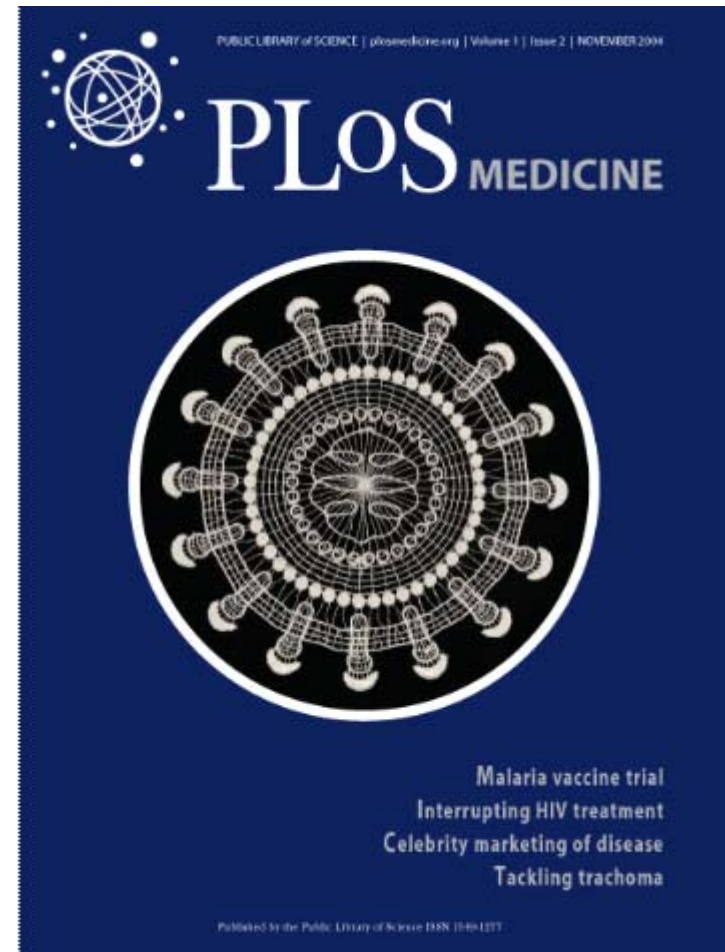

Myth

**YES, BUT HIGH IMPACT JOURNALS

Myth Buster

Has diluted perceived value of higher quality content on paid cable.
