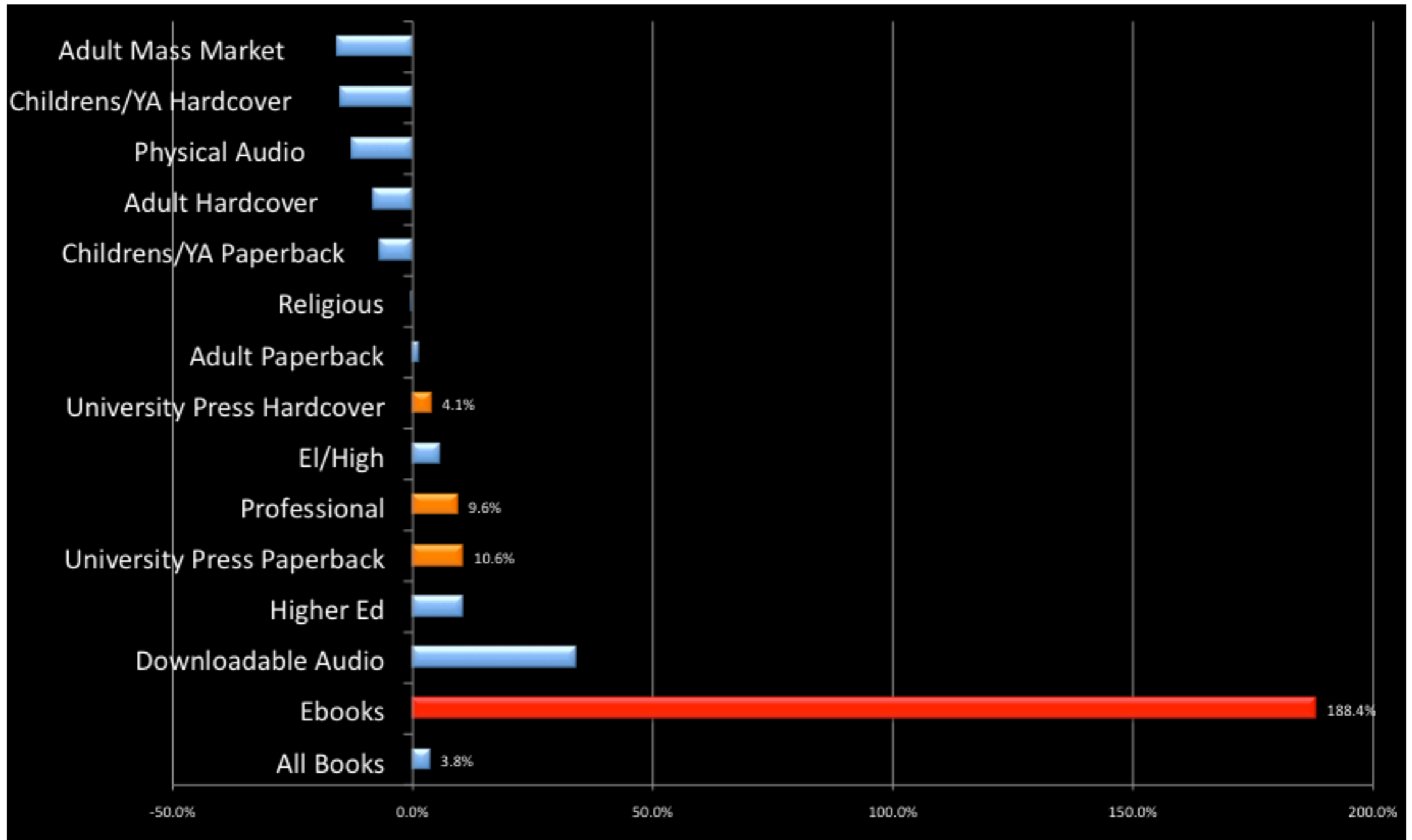

# Ebook Sales Taking Off

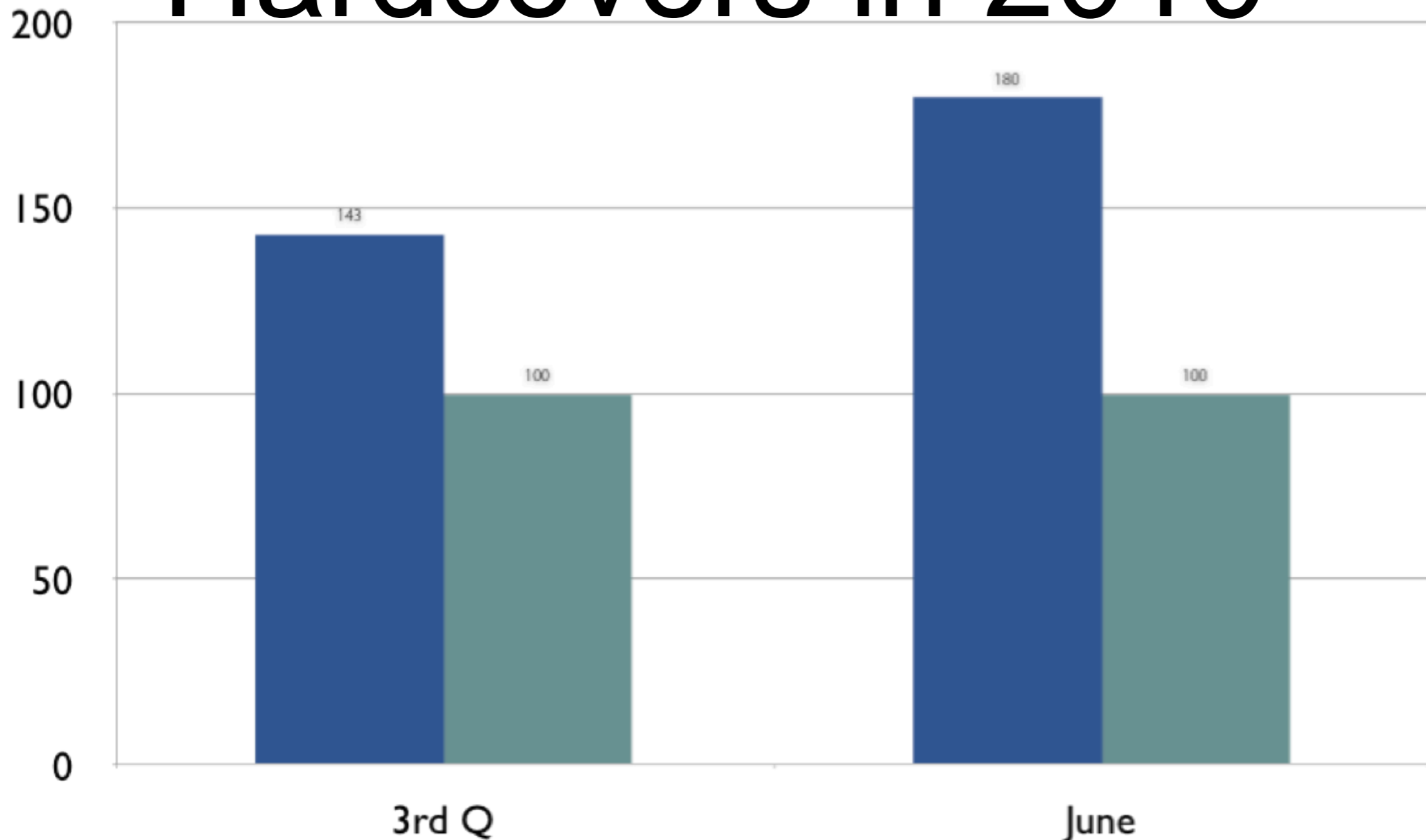

## Accurate Metadata Sells Books

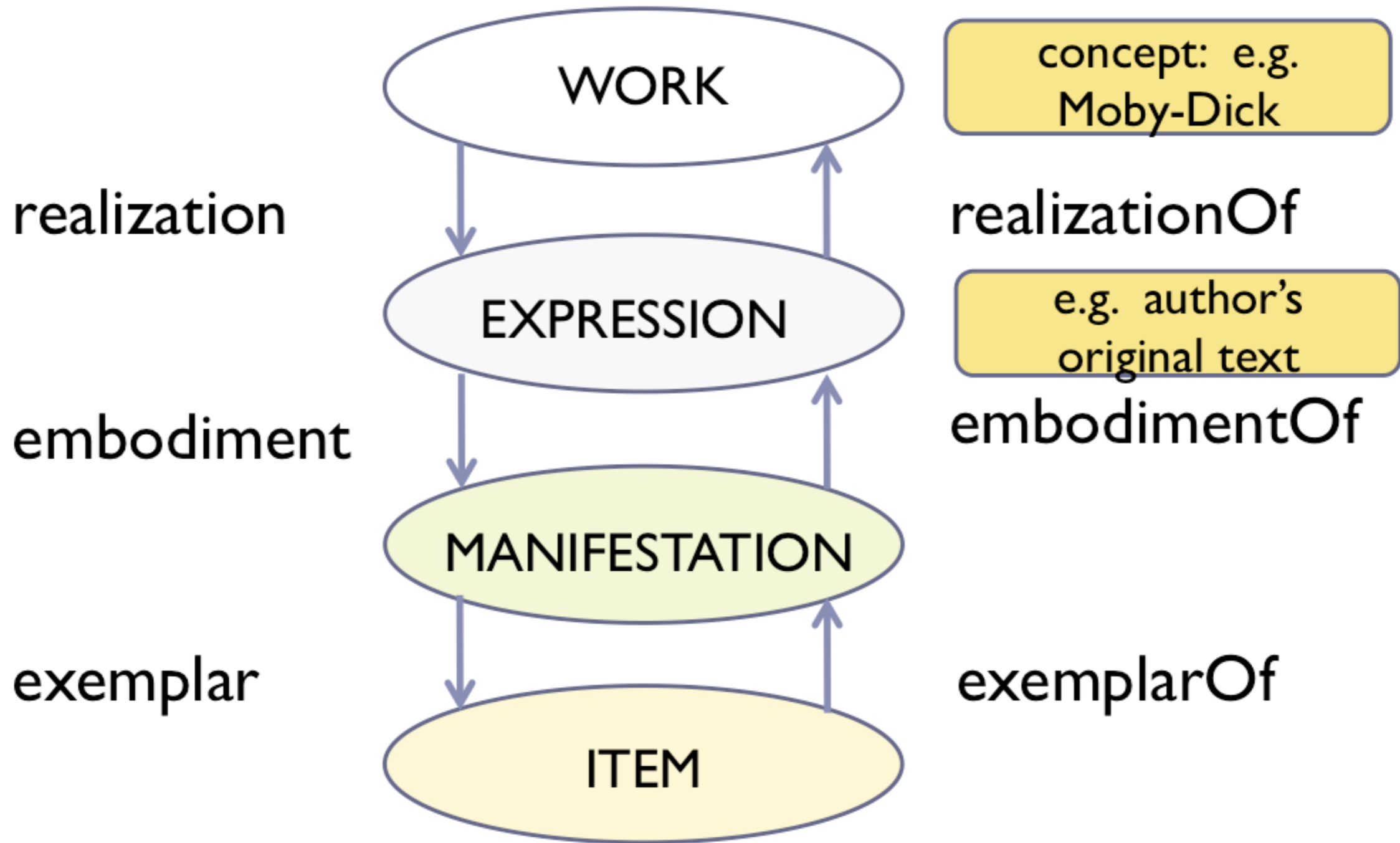

There was a time when metadata—descriptive information such as a book's title, author, or BISAC codes—was something only the warehouse crew had to worry about. "No one saw it," said Laura Dawson, CEO of LJNDawson.com, a consultant specializing in digital publishing services. "It was just warehouse data." But that was before the rise of online retailing at sites like Amazon.com and BN.com as well as the growth in the popularity and sales of e-books.

Now, Dawson said, accurate metadata has become a marketing tool for publishers, a shopping guide for consumers, and an absolute necessity for distributors and retailers. The growth of the importance of metadata, Dawson said, led to the creation of ONIX, or Online Information Exchange, an XML-based standardized format for transmitting information electronically. (XML, or extensible markup language, is a digital format that allows data to be easily reused in other forms.) XML software is said to be easy to use, inexpensive, and its tags or descriptions are easy for people, as well as machines, to read.

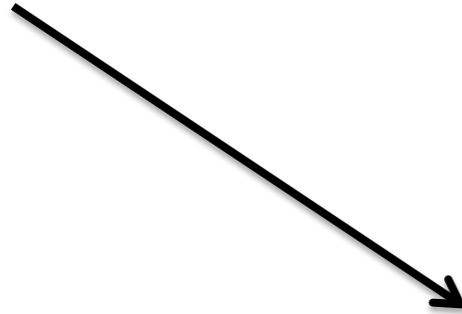

**Excerpt:** "A 39-year-old television reporter, Karen Davis, saw a psychiatrist at her network employee assistance program a few weeks after witnessing the execution of a murderer. For several years she had been following the story of the inmate as he approached execution. The execution itself was remarkably protracted and gruesome; along with colleagues, she maintained a deathwatch for several hours while various last-minute reprieves were gained and then set aside by judicial bodies. At one point the inmate was actually strapped into the chair when a phone call from a federal judge, literally at the last minute, reprieved him, and the inmate was removed from the gas chamber alive. When execution finally occurred, Karen and her colleagues watched from a distance of about 10 feet through the windows of the gas chamber. The inmate's eyes rolled back in his head, and he began to convulse involuntarily, eventually gasping and drooling as his body was racked by convulsions. After approximately 5 minutes, his body was still, and he was declared dead by prison authorities. Karen told the psychiatrist, "Once you see someone die, you don't..."

**Forbes, Dame (Katherine) Jane Trefusis** [*married name* Dame (Katherine) Jane Watson-Watt] (1899-1971), businesswoman and director of the Women's Auxiliary Air Force, was born on 21 March 1899 in the Chilean desert, the youngest of three children, and the second daughter, of Edmund Batten Forbes (1847-1924), civil engineer, and his wife, Charlotte Agnes Wauchope (d. 1958). Little is known about her schooling, except that part of it was conducted in London, but, whether it was learned or inherited, Jane Trefusis Forbes combined a lively and creative mind with formidable and tireless powers of organization and leadership, which served her well in both business and military environments. Her business career was successful and varied. A breeder of prize-winning Dandie Dinmont terriers, in the 1920s she founded Bell Mead kennels and canine nursing home. In the 1930s she combined work as managing director of this enterprise, by now a

#### CONTEMPORARY BIOETHICS

## **DOI ASSIGNMENT AND REFERENCE LINKING IN BOOKS**

Scholarly and professional publishers are increasingly publishing book content online. CrossRef has a critical mass of more than 1.7 million book DOIs registered. This means that there are about 85,000 titles from more than 60 publishers available for reference linking.

CrossRef's Book Working Group has examined current practices in reference processing and metadata deposit for book content, and has issued the following Best Practice recommendations, which will

- Maximize reference linking among books, journals and conference proceedings
  - Enhance the discovery, visibility, and usage of book content
  - Enhance the user's experience through improved functionality
  - Enable the creation of a book citation reporting mechanism which would give book content the visibility, credibility and metrics that journal content has
- 

## **BEST PRACTICES FOR DEPOSITING, LINKING AND CROSSREF DOI USE**

1. Deposit DOIs at the title and chapter/entry level.
2. Add outbound links from references in books as soon as possible.
3. Deposit references from books with CrossRef to enable CrossRef Cited-by Linking.
4. Instruct authors to cite specific chapters and entries using page numbers, chapter/entry titles and DOIs. Although at first authors may not have the DOIs or know what DOIs are, encourage DOI use by authors to build awareness. Add an example of what to put in author guidelines.
5. Update editorial guidelines.
  - a. Ask copyeditors to look for page numbers and chapter titles in book citations.
  - b. Use CrossRef tools to check references as part of the production process so that references can be corrected and missing information added.

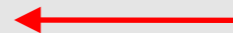

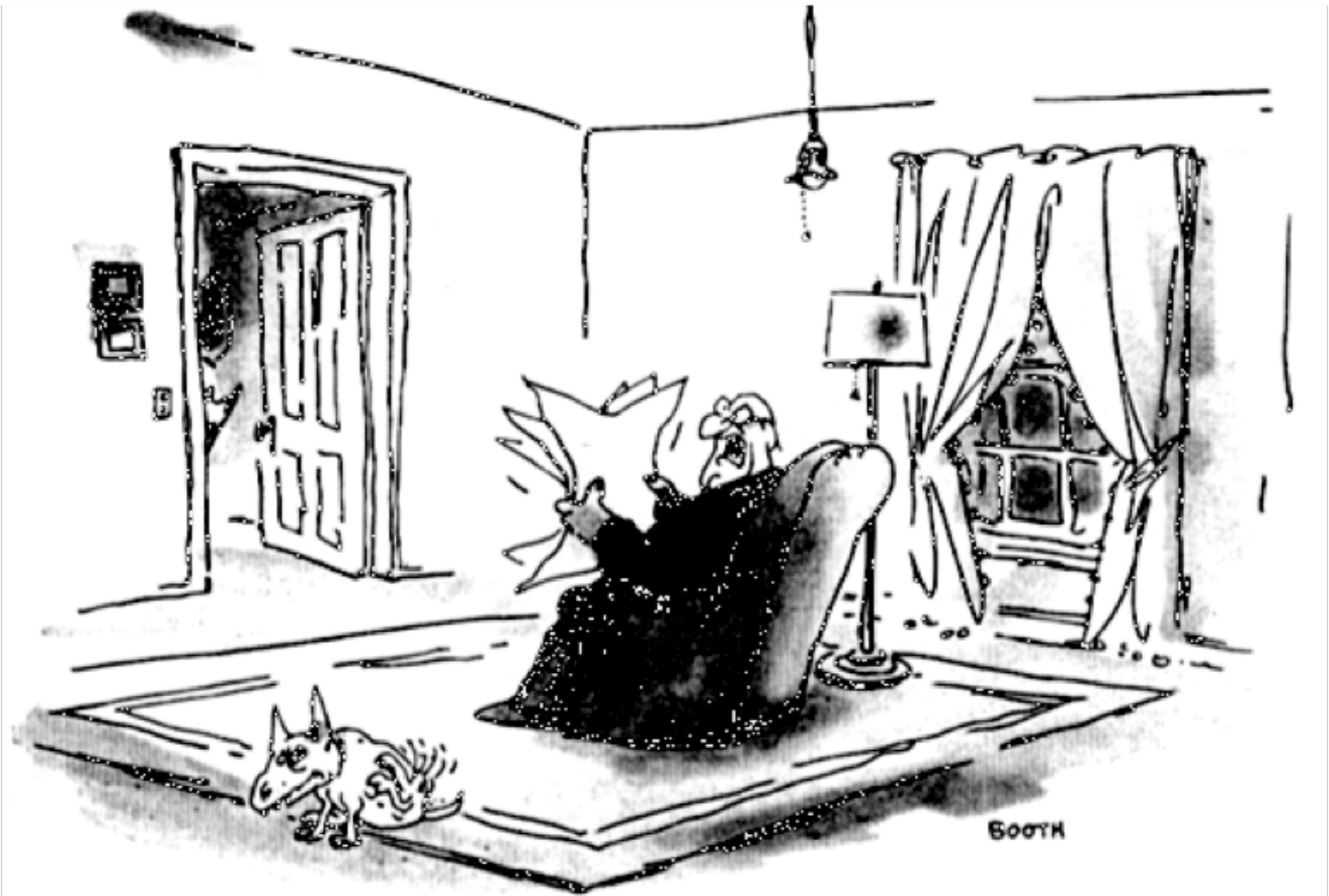
